

For students with known allergies requiring pre-dosed epinephrine, individualized MRCA Allergy Actions Plans signed by the student's physician and parent will be provided by the parent prior to the start of each school year. The student's individualized AAP will be followed in the event of an allergic reaction. Pre-dosed epinephrine provided by the family prior to the start of the school year will be available throughout the school day for the individual student.

For students with asthma requiring an Albuterol inhaler, orders will be followed per their Authorization for Prescription Medication form signed by their physician and parent. Albuterol inhaler provided by their family will be available throughout the school day for the individual student.

The following emergency medications (pre-dosed epinephrine and Albuterol inhaler) have been approved for MRCA to have on hand (school stock) to be used as needed in an emergency by MRCA's Emergency Medicine Team. **These medications will be on hand when available by supporting programs.**

1. Emergency Medicine Team will consist of a minimum of 8 individuals including nursing staff.
2. Emergency Medicine Team training will be completed yearly at minimum.
3. Emergency Medicine Team training will include training related to the administration of lifesaving medications (pre-dosed epinephrine and Albuterol inhaler), techniques on how to recognize symptoms of severe allergic reactions or medical emergencies, including anaphylaxis and the standards and procedures for the storage and administration of lifesaving medications.
4. In the event of severe allergic reaction or medical emergency requiring pre-dosed epinephrine or albuterol inhaler, the Emergency Medicine Team will be notified via walkie talkie of emergency and location. A debrief meeting will be held to determine adequacy and speed of response and ways to reduce risk for the future.
5. Emergency Medicine will be administered in concordance with MRCA's standing orders for emergency medication.
